#### **ORDER 2021**

#### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL has made the above Order under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The effect of the Order is to close access points into the Dane John Gardens on Friday and Saturday nights at the following locations:

- 1. Watling Street, approximately 9 metres north west of the junction with St George's Lane
- 2. Access point immediately west of the property 7 Dane John
- 3. Access point leading through the western boundary wall of Watling Street car park
- 4. Opposite the junction of St Mary's Street and Marlowe Avenue
- 5. Access point adjacent to the property 16 Dane John

The Order will come into operation on 18 June 2021 and may last for a maximum period of 18 months. Kent County Council will then be considering, in due course, whether the experimental order should be continued in force indefinitely.

Full details are contained in the draft order which, together with a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the order, and a map showing the location of the closures may be examined at Canterbury City Council Offices in Military Road, Canterbury CT1 1YW and at <a href="https://www.canterbury.gov.uk/consultations">www.canterbury.gov.uk/consultations</a>

### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

The Kent County Council, acting as the Local Traffic Authority and in exercise of its powers under sections 9 and 10 of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, ('the Act') as amended, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:

This Order may be cited as "The Kent County Council (Dane John Gardens, Canterbury) (Experimental Footpath Closures) Order 2021" ('this Order') and shall come into operation on 18th day of June 2021.

### **CLOSURE OF PEDESTRIAN ACCESS POINTS**

1. Access points at the locations set out in the table below shall be closed to all users at 22.00 every Friday and Saturday evening until 4.00 on the following morning.

#### **AUTHORITY TO CLOSE ACCESS POINTS**

Except with the permission or instruction of the Chief Constable of Police, access points at the locations set out in the table may only be closed by personnel authorised by Canterbury City Council or Kent County Council

Item	Location	Description of Location
1	Dane John Gardens entrance from Watling Street	Approximately 9 metres north west of the junction with St George's Lane
2	Footpath number 5601802	Access point immediately west of the property 7 Dane John
3	Footpath number 5601802	Access point leading through the western boundary wall of Watling Street car park
4	Footpath number 5601802	Opposite the junction of St Mary's Street and Marlowe Avenue
5	Footpath number 5601802	Access point adjacent to the property 16 Dane John


Unless this Order is revoked or made permanent by a subsequent Order, this Order shall cease to have effect on 17<sup>th</sup> day of December 2022.
