Everyone is experiencing increasing costs and the council is no exception. A high rate of inflation increases the demands on some of our services while also making them more expensive to run.

Where we charge to recover the cost of providing a service or charge market rates, we propose to increase fees and charges by 10% or the equivalent of the extra costs incurred.

All fees and charges in Appendix 4 have been reviewed individually and, where there is capacity to increase fees to cover costs, we propose they should be increased.

There are some fee levels that are fixed by the government and cannot be amended.
